<u>RESOLUTION 2013-S-132</u> – Exemption for Outdoor Beverage Service at the Reeds at Shelter Haven

RESOLUTION GRANTING AN EXEMPTION FOR OUTDOOR BEVERAGE SERVICE AT THE REEDS HOTEL

WHEREAS, The Reeds Hotel at 96th Street and Third Avenue has recently completed the construction of a top-flight, hospitality facility in the Borough of Stone Harbor; and

WHEREAS, in connection with said construction, The Reeds applied for and was issued

local and state permits for the installation of four, 50 foot-long steel pilings, which were installed 30 feet into the bed of the bay, as well as the installation of an engineered roofing system of cables and custom canopy roofing system, expressly designed for use as a bar area; and

WHEREAS, said construction was inspected and approved by the Borough which issued a certificate of occupancy on June 20, 2013, and effective July 1, 2013, the Borough issued a liquor license for the premises which allows the service of alcoholic beverages upon the rear yard area of the property; and

WHEREAS, R.G.O. 134-4(D)(1) allows the Borough Council to grant an exemption from certain restrictions upon such beverage service included in R.G.O. 134-4; and

WHEREAS, the intention of that ordinance was clearly to address noise-related concerns that existed when the ordinance was adopted in 1982, and the amendment of said ordinance to reflect current conditions has been referred to the Administration and Finance Committee; and

WHEREAS, the bar area is a permanent structure with semi-permanent features, the construction of which was approved by the Borough and the area in which it is situated approved for beverage service; and

WHEREAS, The Reeds has committed to utilizing the area in a manner that is not volatile of local ordinances; the intent of service restrictions contained in current ordinances was clearly to address noise related concerns and the bar structure appears to meet the spirit of those restrictions inasmuch as it is considered a structure by the Construction and Zoning Offices; is approximately 20 feet from the inside service area and prohibiting its use would not appear to advance the noise-abatement intent of R.G.O. 134-4;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey, duly assembled in public session this 2^{nd} day of July, 2013, as follows:

- 1. The Preamble of this Resolution is hereby incorporated by reference and these findings are specifically limited to The Reeds property;
- 2. The aforementioned outdoor service is hereby approved as detailed in the liquor license; as approved by the Certificate of Occupancy and as detailed hereinabove by this Resolution.
- 3. This exemption is granted upon the condition that The Reeds continue to comply with the Borough's noise ordinance and all other applicable ordinances and statutes dealing with peace and good order and alcoholic beverage control.
