WHEREAS, the Borough of Stone Harbor maintains a Beach Patrol for the protection of the health, safety and welfare of beach-goers during the summer season and also maintains a contingent of beach tag personnel in order to enforce the Borough's beach tag ordinance and provide convenient points of sale of beach tags to visitors; and

WHEREAS, the Beach and Recreation Committee of Borough Council have determined that it is in the best interests of the Borough to provide a more competitive wage scheduled, complete with certain incentives, in order to continue to attract qualified and committed persons to serve as lifeguards on the Borough's beaches:

<u>If a lifeguard qualifies for the above incentive bonus</u> then they may also qualify for the following extra bonus:

For August 15th through Labor Day, a lifeguard will receive an additional bonus of \$ 10 per day worked in this time period to be paid in their final pay.

ENGINEER'S REPORT - Mark DeBlasio, Borough Engineer, provided the Engineer's report as follows:

FY 2013 NJDOT Transportation Trust Fund

• The Borough was awarded a \$175,000.00 grant to reconstruct First Avenue from 89th Street to 80th Street.

Beach Outfall Elimination Project – Phase 2

- Work is substantially complete.
- Punchlist to be completed.

NJDEP Water Allocation Permit

 The water allocation permit modification which increases monthly and annual diversion limits has been submitted to NJDEP BWA and deemed administratively complete. The application is under staff review.

USDA Rural Business Enterprise Grant (RBEG) Application

- The Borough was denied grant funding for planning and streetscape improvements.
- However, the application can be re-submitted to USDA for FY 2013.

95th Street Water Tank Improvements and Repainting

- The bid opening was held on December 13, 2012 and the apparent low bidder is Corrosion Control Corporation in the amount of \$484,200.00
- A pre-construction meeting was held on January 24, 2013.
- The blasting equipment has been delivered to the site.
- Interior painting repairs have begun.
- Exterior painting will begin this week.

95th Street Well Redevelopment

- The bid opening occurred on February 7, 2013.
- Uni-Tech Drilling was awarded the contract in the amount of \$112,900.00.
- A pre-construction meeting was held on May 2, 2013 at 1:30 PM.
- Construction is scheduled to begin September 16, 2013.

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Beach Concession Stand

• The contract has been awarded to Atlantic Ice Cream, LLC in the amount of \$124,464.00 for a two year total.

9/11 Memorial Park

- We have completed the survey and base mapping for the project.
- We have been authorized to complete bid documents and the design is approximately 60% complete.
- We have completed the Cape May County Open Space Application.

FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program

- This grant program provides a 75% grant for various flood mitigation projects.
- The Borough has selected to submit five (5) grant applications and the first step is to submit a Letter of Intent for each project by March 31, 2013

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DISCUSSION:

Councilmember Lane stated that Stone Harbor has the Chamber Chatter and the ROA that provide updates electronically to our citizens, but she has found that a lot of communities do monthly e-mails to their residents and she has been discussing this issue with Scott Wahl. Councilmember Lane asked Mr. Wahl to explain the concept. Mr. Wahl stated that most communities use the "constant contact e-mail service" which is very easy to use and includes a lot of graphics and sub-links to other websites and is fairly easy to put together. Mr. Wahl explained that most towns use this on a monthly basis with input from most of their departments. Mr. Wahl stated that residents would have to opt-in – meaning that each home-owner would have to indicate that they would like to receive the email. The "constant contact" fees are very low and the company charges for the number of contacts the town has in its data base, i.e., for the town the size of Stone Harbor, maybe a few hundred dollars

per year. Mr. Wahl stated that a great time to launch something like "constant contact" would be at the same time the Borough would possibly be launching its new website, which is currently under consideration. Mr. Wahl stated that "constant contact" also provides very good analytical information – how many people open e-mails, how many people sign-up for the month, how many people drop-off for the month, etc. Mr. Wahl stated that another big use for "constant contact" would be during storm – emergency conditions and providing up-to-date information all the time.

Councilmember Rich provided an update on the beach replenishment project. Councilmember Rich reported that due to inclement weather, the dredge has been unable to leave Cape May. Councilmember Rich reported that the project was originally scheduled to begin April 25, 2013; and we just need to hope for calm seas so it can return to Stone Harbor and begin pumping sand once again. Councilmember Rich reported that the Mayor, Councilmembers Mastrangelo and Carusi, Jill Gougher, Scott Wahl, and Public Works have been attending weekly meetings held every Wednesday at 1:00 p.m. for beach replenishment updates. Mayor Walters reported that when the project begins, they will be blocking off a 1,000 yards at a time (approximately 3 blocks) and people may be inconvenienced for a day or two. Mayor Walters that this is a 100% federally funded beach replenishment consisting of 420,000 cubic yards of sand.

Sam Thomas – 100 111th Street – is there any danger of a drop dead date that the dredge has to go somewhere else. Mayor Walters responded that she is not aware of any, but she is aware that the company has signed a contract with North Wildwood.

Councilmember Rich provided an update on the library. Councilmember Rich reported that there was Library Design Committee and Library Programs Committee meetings held on April 30, 2013 and Freeholder Marie Hayes, Marie McMahon, Facilities Director, Deb Poillon, Library Director were in attendance. Councilmember Rich reported that the bank building will be demolished and it will be demolished before Memorial Day weekend, possibly beginning on May 15, 2013. Councilmember Rich reported that the County is also in the process of awarding the architect contract. Councilmember Rich stated the Borough has asked for the County's permission to make the lot where the bank building is more attractive so that it does not look like a construction site until the library project begins. Councilmember Rich stated that as information becomes available; she will make it available to the public. Councilmember Lane reported that her Committee also had an excellent meeting with the County and they gave members of the Committee homework. Councilmember Lane stated that her Committee is a very anxious and active group and are in the process of assembling information. Councilmember Lane stated once this task is complete, the Committee will meet with the County.

Councilmember Rich thanked Jill Gougher for negotiating such a good contract with Duffield.

Councilmember Kramar thanked Public Works for doing such a great job on Bulk Trash.

Councilmember Lane stated that the Garden Club Plant and Bake Sale is this weekend and will be at the Fire House on Saturday from 8:00 a.m. til 1:00 p.m.
