$\frac{\text{HEARING OF THE PUBLIC ON MEMORIALS, RESOLUTIONS, PETITIONS \& }{\text{COMPLAINTS}}$

Geoff Woolery, 217 110th Street: Re: Water/Sewer Rate Increase 2023. He reviewed the discussion of the \$27 million dollars debt within the Water/Sewer Department, the sewer volume deficit towards the Cape May County MUA billing and the proposed decrease in the water/sewer rate schedule. Mr. Woolery wants to ensure that the Mayor and Council is considering the large debt that currently exists and the rising interest rates and rising cost of operation and ensuring that all aspects are closely reviewed.

Rich Fuchs, 8614 Pennsylvania Avenue (Via Zoom): Speaking on behalf of the Stone Harbor Property Association on the subject of beach tags. He reviewed the CFO report which indicated that there were approximately 2,000 less tags purchased in 2022. He has concerns with Stone Harbor residents not supporting the Stone Harbor Beach Patrol by purchasing their beach tag in Avalon. (Avalon tags were less expensive than Stone Harbor tags – towns are reciprocal) Avalon operates their beach patrol as a utility and runs a deficit – that deficit is covered by taxation which has no effect on the beach tag price. The deficit, if responsible for beach patrol costs, would result in an increase in beach tag fees of 44%. Mr. Fuchs encourages Stone Harbor to engage in conversation with Avalon regarding beach tags fees and reciprocity.

No Further Comments Presented from the Public.

Councilmember Parzych thanked Geoff Woolery for his comments. Councilmember Parzych advised that the utilities committee reviewed the water/sewer rate changes at length and that she was the minority. Councilmember Parzych is not in support of lowering user fees and she asked Mayor and Council to give consideration to her thoughts when the Ordinance is presented for 2nd, 3rd and final vote on December 6th.

Mayor Davies-Dunhour explained the process of discussion on items that are being presented to the council for a vote. The Work session provides a comment, question/answer portion to review concerns and the current discussion is not on the agenda. Moving forward Mayor Davies-Dunhour encourages the Council to follow procedure.

Councilmember Gensemer asked a procedural question: When a committee chair no longer supports an item presented for vote what is the process. Mayor Davies-Dunhour explained that the item presented has already been introduced and approved by Council and must now be offered for a final vote, at which time it may be voted for or against.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Stone Harbor is currently under contract with Aliano Brothers General Contractors, Inc. 2560 Industrial Way, Vineland, N.J. 08360 for the Construction of the Beach Patrol Headquarters, File project #: SH-C-020; and

WHEREAS, it is the recommendation of the Borough's Engineer, Marc DeBlasio, of DeBlasio & Associates to authorize Change Order No. 2 – Final which reflects the following additional work required during construction:

- 1. S2 The addition of an underground telephone conduit for the elevator phone service.
- 2. S3 Revision to the door hardware schedule after shop drawing review.
- 3. S4 Borough requests to remove a toilet from the Men's locker room and replace it with a urinal
- 4. S5- Borough requests for an addition of a heater in the garage area to allow for year-round use of the building
- 5. S8 Borough requests for CAT6 cables for the addition of two webcams installed on the crow's nest
- 6. S9 Borough requests for additional tubing for low voltage cables from the IT room to various office spaces
- 7. S10 Installation of large paddle fans in the garage and open office.
- 8. S11- Borough requests for hot water for the outside showers
- 9. S12 Toilet room accessories to be supplied by the contractor in lieu of purchased by Public Works.
- 10. S13 The use of a temporary generator for the elevator installation, due to the long lead time on the electrical panel.
- 11. S14 The interior staircase material was changed to a rubber tread after discussion with the contractor and Borough. Also, additional beams and finish work were required to create a uniform final product.
- 12. S19 Building contractor repaired various parking lot lighting damaged during demolition and investigative work to ensure all parking lot lighting is operational.

WHEREAS, Change Order No. 2 – will result in a increase of \$42,719.25 to the amended contract amount of \$ \$ 2,841,871.00 for a final contract amount of \$ 2,884,590.25.
