ORDINANCE NO. 1622

BOND ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$1,964,000, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,865,800 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH, FOR VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS OR PURPOSES AUTHORIZED TO BE UNDERTAKEN BY THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR, IN THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR, IN THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The several improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby respectively authorized as general improvements to be made or acquired by The Borough of Stone Harbor, New Jersey. For the said several improvements or purposes stated in said Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of money therein stated as the appropriations made for said improvements or purposes, said sums being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor and amounting in the aggregate to \$1,964,000 including the aggregate sum of \$98,200 as the several down payments for said improvements or purposes required by law and more particularly described in said Section 3 and now available therefor by virtue of provision in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Borough for down payment or for capital improvement purposes.

Section 2. For the financing of said improvements or purposes, including for the purposes of applicable United States Treasury regulations the reimbursement of expenditures heretofore or hereafter made therefor, and to meet the part of said \$1,964,000 appropriations not provided for by application hereunder of said down payments, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$1,865,800 pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable notes of the Borough in a principal amount not exceeding \$1,865,800 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 3. The improvements hereby authorized and the several purposes for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued, the appropriation made for and estimated cost of each such purpose, and the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for each such purpose, are respectively as follows:

IMPROVEMENT OR PURPOSE

(a) Improvement of 122nd Street in and by the Borough by the reconstruction and resurfacing thereof to provide a roadway pavement at least equal in useful life or durability to a roadway surface of Class B construction (as such term is used or referred to in Section 40A:2-22 of said Local Bond Law), including all guide rails, reflectors, signage, dividers, milling, drainage structures and improvements, equipment, site work, work and materials necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor on file or to be filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and hereby approved, the \$164,000 appropriation hereby made therefor being exclusive of the sum of \$170,000 received or expected to be received by the Borough from the New Jersey Department of Transportation as a grant-in-aid of financing said improvement

(b) Improvement of municipally-owned beach property in and by the Borough, including the replenishment of sand, together with all structures, appurtenances, equipment, work and materials necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor on file or to be filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and hereby approved

The excess of the appropriation made for each of the improvements or purposes aforesaid over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor, as above stated, is the amount of the said down payment for said purpose.

Section 4. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The said purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses and each is a property or improvement which the Borough may lawfully acquire or make as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The average period of usefulness of said purposes within the limitations of said Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the respective amounts of the said obligations authorized for the several purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 14.58 years.
- (c) The supplemental debt statement required by said Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in said Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided for in this bond ordinance by \$1,865,800, and the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.
- (d) Amounts not exceeding \$200,000 in the aggregate for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs and other items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 40A:2-20 of said Local Bond Law may be included as part of the costs of said improvements and are included in the foregoing estimate thereof.

Section 5. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer, the acting chief financial officer or the treasurer of the Borough (the "Chief Financial Officer"), provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer.

The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with the notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the Chief Financial Officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. §40A:2-8. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale at not less than par and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the dates of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body of the Borough at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the principal amount, interest rate and maturities of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 6. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance.

Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of said obligations and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 7. The capital budget or temporary capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing all detail of the amended capital budget or temporary capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, are on file with the Borough Clerk and are available for public inspection.

Section 8. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by said Local Bond Law.

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF THE WATER AND SEWERAGE SYSTEM IN AND OF THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR, IN THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$316,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$316,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH FOR FINANCING SUCH APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR, IN THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized as a general improvement to be made or acquired by The Borough of Stone Harbor, New Jersey. For the said improvement or purpose stated in said Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$316,000 said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor.

Section 2. For the financing of said improvement or purpose, including for the purposes of applicable United States Treasury regulations the reimbursement of expenditures heretofore or hereafter made therefor, and to meet said \$316,000 appropriation, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$316,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvement or purpose, negotiable notes of the Borough in a principal amount not exceeding \$316,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

- Section 3. (a) The improvement hereby authorized and the purpose for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued is the improvement of the water and sewerage system in and of the Borough, including the upgrade of existing and installation of new water and sewer pipes in and along 122nd Street, together with all storm drains, pumps, roadway reconstruction, concrete curbs, gutters, structures, site work, equipment, work and materials necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor on file or to be filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and hereby approved.
- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said purpose is \$316,000.
 - (c) The estimated cost of said purpose is \$316,000.
- Section 4. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:
- (a) The said purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense and is a property or improvement which the Borough may lawfully acquire or make as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The period of usefulness of said purpose within the limitations of said Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is forty (40) years.

APPROVING UPDATES TO DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS WORK RULES

WHEREAS, general law authorizes the Department of Public Works to establish certain work rules not in conflict with a collective bargaining agreement; and

WHEREAS, changes and/or additions to the work rules are not negotiable; and

WHEREAS, the following items are being recommended:

- 1. Reference newest contract on file (Section 1.1)
- 2. New Rule: Can not wear DPW logo unless on duty (Section 3.6)
- 3. Earned Sick leave: State rule: 1 hour for every 30 hours worked. After an employee becomes permanent the sick leave changes to 1 day per month retroactive to date of hire. (Section 5.1)
- 4. Encouraging zero emission vehicles preferred parking will be offered to any employee who uses an electric vehicle. (Section 6)
- 5. Adding Modified Work Duty clarifies ability to return to work after injury with limitations. (Section 11.6)
- 6. Overtime Rules: If there is a planned overtime event: volunteers first within the division; then volunteers within entire department; then forced overtime within division; finally forced overtime throughout public works. Forced overtime will be rotated throughout all employees within DPW as opposed to being forced on the least senior position consistently as it has been done in the past. (Section 14)

On call for beaches and streets will be removed since the parking kiosk/meters will no longer be utilized. Water/Sewer department still has an on-call system in place.

Department of Public Works Work Rules are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, duly assembled in public session this 7th day of February, 2023, that the updates to the Department of Public Works Work Rules attached be and hereby are approved and adopted.

AMENDING ARTICLE 10, UNIFORMS, OF THE COLLECTIVE BARGAINING UNIT BETWEEN THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR AND AFSCME NJ COUNCIL 63

WHEREAS, the Borough wishes to improve the uniform service provided to Union employees which is set forth in Article Ten of the CNA; and

WHEREAS, to accomplish this, the Borough wishes to provide uniforms in an alternate manner and remove reference to the Uniform Supply Company that has been coordinating the elements of the uniforms described in Article Ten of the CNA; and

WHEREAS, in its place, the Borough would provide each employee covered in the Collective Bargaining Agreement with a One Thousand (\$1000) stipend (allowance) at a local uniform supply retailer whereby the employee would then have the ability to visit the retail establishment selected and order the type of clothing that would best compliment their specific work tasks in accordance with the terms set forth below; and

WHEREAS, this is in the best interest of both the Borough and the employee as each employee can tailor his/her uniform type and quantities to his/her specific needs.

NOW, THEREFORE, intending to amend Article Ten of the current CNA, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The statements of the preamble are hereby incorporated as if set forth fully herein.
- 2. Article Ten, paragraph 1A and 1B of the parties CNA shall be eliminated and replaced with the following:
 - a. The Borough will provide each employee covered in this Agreement with a One Thousand Dollar (\$1,000) allowance at a local uniform supply retailer whereby the employee has the ability to visit the retail establishment selected and order the type of clothing that would best compliment their specific work tasks.
 - b. The employee may select from a pre-established list of cargo shorts, work pants, short sleeve shirts, sweatshirts and long sleeve shirts in whatever quantity fits their working conditions best up to the \$1000 limit on the account.
 - c. Limits on the color and type of clothing available will be made by the Borough and logos or identification on the outer garments (such as "SHDPW") will be made by the retailer. Petitions for the purchase of nonstandard or previously established items will be reviewed and approved at the discretion of the Director.
- 3. All other aspects of Article Ten relative to cleaning, work shoes and wearing of the uniforms only during working hours and traveling to and from home shall remain effective. Upon early termination of an employee, regardless of the cause of termination, Employee shall return all uniforms purchased through the allowance to the Borough. Uniform Allowances will be funded upon the successful end of a probationary period and is not applicable to seasonal or part-time employees.
- 4. The Borough may, in its discretion provide additional uniforms to the mechanics or assistants.
- 5. All other articles in the current CNA shall remain in full force and effect.

AGREEMENT FOR THE RESALE OF GASOLINE AND DIESEL FUEL AS PART OF A COMMODITY RESALE SYSTEM

THIS AGREEMENT for the resale of fuel is made on this ___ day of _____, 2022, by and between the Borough of Stone Harbor, whose administrative offices are located at 9508 Second Avenue, Stone Harbor, New Jersey 08247 ("Member"), and the County of Cape May, whose administrative offices are located at 4 Moore Road, Cape May Court House, New Jersey 08210 ("County"). The Member and County are collectively referred to as "Parties," and singularly as a "Party."

WHEREAS, the Commodity Resale Provisions of the Cooperative Pricing and Join Purchasing Rules (N.J.A.C. 5:34-7.1, *et seq.*) authorize and empower the Parties to enter into this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the County owns and operates fuel storage and dispensing facilities for its own needs and, as a matter of comity and in the interest of sparing taxpayers from a duplication of expense, is willing to grant the Member's request to become part of the Commodity Resale System, subject to the terms and conditions in this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. The above recitals are incorporated herein as if repeated at length.
- 2. Member shall provide a resolution formally adopted by its governing body stating its willingness to participate as a Member of the Commodity Resale System and in accordance with the terms and conditions set by the County.
- 3. Immediately upon the execution of this Agreement by the Parties, the Member shall supply to the County its best estimate of how much fuel (gasoline and/or diesel) it will require for the 2023 calendar year by December 1, 2022. In subsequent years under this Agreement, the Member shall supply this estimate for the following calendar year to the County by October 1.
- 4. The County shall bill the Member at the end of each month for the actual gallons used, and the billing shall include a service charge as specified in paragraph #15 *infra*. Within fourteen (14) days of receiving the bill from the County, the Member will issue a voucher to the County for the full amount of the bill.

- 5. The Member agrees to keep the County apprised, on a continuous basis, of additions or deletions to its vehicle inventory and employee list
- 6. Upon the full execution of this Agreement and receipt of documentation of insurance as specified in paragraph #10 *infra*, the County shall issue appropriate identification codes to the Member to enable access to the County's fuel dispensing facilities, in accordance with the existing computerized fuel delivery system at County's facilities.
- 7. The price of petroleum products is based on Philadelphia low posting in the Journal of Commerce (which changes four times per week on average). Accordingly, the price per gallon will be averaged for the respective month for billing purposes.
- 8. The Member agrees that it shall be solely responsible for the appropriate and authorized use of the identification codes issued by the County, and the County takes no responsibility to supervise or monitor the day-to-day use of said identification codes. Any misuse of the identification codes, along with any resulting misappropriation of fuel, shall be the liability of the Member and the County accepts no responsibility whatsoever for such irregularities. Further, any misuse may result in the Member's access being suspended and/or terminated.
- 9. The Member hereby agrees to indemnify the County and to hold it harmless against any claims, losses, damages, or expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees) for which the County may become liable (or for which the County may be alleged to be liable), as a result of the Member's use of County's facilities, including any persons or vehicles using the fuel dispensing codes issued to the Member under this Agreement.
- 10. Within fourteen (14) days of execution of this Agreement, the Member shall provide to the County a Certificate of Liability Insurance showing the extent of the Member's liability coverage and naming of the County of Cape May as an additional insured. Thereafter, the Member shall provide to the County a Certificate evidencing same annually during the term of this Agreement. Failure to provide the required documentation within the specified time may cause suspension of service as provided in paragraph #14 infra.
- 11. This Agreement shall run for a term of five (5) years, nunc pro tunc, from November 1, 2022 and expiring on October 31, 2027. Either Party may, however, terminate this Agreement after ninety (90)

- calendar days by serving notice in writing on the other Party of its intention to do so.
- 12. After appropriate consultation with the Member during emergency situations, the County will assign certain days, hours, and locations for the use of County's fuel dispensing facilities by the Member. Additional access to the said facilities in emergency situations will be authorized by the County on a case-by-case basis.
- 13. The Member shall be responsible for arranging and establishing its own emergency source of fuel for those occasions when the County's system is unavoidably inoperable. The County shall not be responsible to the Member for any losses or damages that might be incurred by the Member as a result of temporary closure of the County's fuel dispensing facilities.
- 14. In the event of any breach or default of the Member's obligations under this Agreement, the County reserves the right to suspend or to terminate this Agreement, in the County's sole discretion, upon fourteen (14) days written notice to the Member.
- 15. The Member shall pay a service charge (for costs of administration, maintenance, insurance, wear and tear on equipment) in the amount of \$.081 per gallon of fuel dispensed. The service charge will remain at this level through December 31, 2023. If the County's expenses require an increase to this charge, it will advise the Member in writing on or before October 1.
- 16. Any and all future alterations to current procedures will be authorized by written amendments issued by the County.
