BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY

ORDINANCE NO. 1640

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF THE WATER AND SEWERAGE SYSTEM (89th STREET) IN AND OF THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR, IN THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$316,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$316,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH FOR FINANCING SUCH APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR, IN THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized as a general improvement to be made or acquired by The Borough of Stone Harbor, New Jersey. For the said improvement or purpose stated in said Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$316,000 said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor and including the sum of 16,000 as the down payment for said improvement or purpose required by law and now available therefor by virtue of provision in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Borough for down payment or for capital improvement purposes.

Section 2. For the financing of said improvement or purpose, including for the purposes of applicable United States Treasury regulations the reimbursement of expenditures heretofore or hereafter made therefor, and to meet the part of said \$316,000 appropriation not provided for by application hereunder of said down payment, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$300,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvement or purpose, negotiable notes of the Borough in a principal amount not exceeding \$300,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

- Section 3. (a) The improvement hereby authorized and the purpose for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued is the improvement of the water and sewerage system in and of the Borough, including the upgrade of existing and installation of new water and sewer pipes in and along 89th Street, together with all storm drains, pumps, roadway reconstruction, concrete curbs, gutters, structures, site work, equipment, work and materials necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor on file or to be filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and hereby approved.
- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said purpose is \$300,000.
- (c) The estimated cost of said purpose is \$316,000, the excess thereof over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor being the amount of the said \$16,000 down payment for said purpose.

Section 4. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The said purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense and is a property or improvement which the Borough may lawfully acquire or make as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The period of usefulness of said purpose within the limitations of said Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is forty (40) years.

- The supplemental debt statement required by said Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in said Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided for in this bond ordinance by \$300,000, and the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.
- An aggregate amount not exceeding \$35,000 for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs and other items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 40A:2-20 of said Local Bond Law may be included as part of the cost of said improvement and is included in the foregoing estimate thereof.

All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer, the acting chief financial officer or the treasurer of the Borough (the "Chief Financial Officer"), provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with the notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the Chief Financial Officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. §40A:2-8. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale at not less than par and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the dates of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body of the Borough at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the principal amount, interest rate and maturities of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged Section 6. to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and, unless paid from the revenues of the water and sewerage system of the Borough, the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of said obligations and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

The capital budget or temporary capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing all detail of the amended capital budget or temporary capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, are on file with the Borough Clerk and are available for public inspection.

BOND ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$2,202,500 AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,092,375 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH, FOR VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS OR PURPOSES AUTHORIZED TO BE UNDERTAKEN BY THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR, IN THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR, IN THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The several improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby respectively authorized as general improvements to be made or acquired by The Borough of Stone Harbor, New Jersey. For the said several improvements or purposes stated in said Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of money therein stated as the appropriations made for said improvements or purposes, said sums being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor and amounting in the aggregate to \$2,202,500 including the aggregate sum of \$110,125 as the several down payments for said improvements or purposes required by law and more particularly described in said Section 3 and now available therefor by virtue of provision in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Borough for down payment or for capital improvement purposes.

Section 2. For the financing of said improvements or purposes, including for the purposes of applicable United States Treasury regulations the reimbursement of expenditures heretofore or hereafter made therefor, and to meet the part of said \$2,202,500 appropriations not provided for by application hereunder of said down payments, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$2,092,375 pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable notes of the Borough in a principal amount not exceeding \$2,092,375 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 3. The improvements hereby authorized and the several purposes for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued, the appropriation made for and estimated cost of each such purpose, and the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for each such purpose, are respectively as follows:

The excess of the appropriation made for each of the improvements or purposes aforesaid over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor, as above stated, is the amount of the said down payment for said purpose.

Section 4. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The said purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses and each is a property or improvement which the Borough may lawfully acquire or make as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The average period of usefulness of said purposes within the limitations of said Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the respective amounts of the said obligations authorized for the several purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 11.20 years.
- (c) The supplemental debt statement required by said Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in said Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided for in this bond ordinance by \$2,092,375, and the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.
- (d) Amounts not exceeding \$200,000 in the aggregate for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs and other items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 40A:2-20 of said Local Bond Law may be included as part of the costs of said improvements and are included in the foregoing estimate thereof.

Section 5. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer, the acting chief financial officer or the treasurer of the Borough (the "Chief Financial Officer"), provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with the notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the Chief Financial Officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. §40A:2-8. The capital budget or temporary capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing all detail of the amended capital budget or temporary capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, are on file with the Borough Clerk and are available for public inspection.

Section 8. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by said Local Bond Law.

ORDINANCE 1642

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCES 134, 156, 162, 241, 357, 363, 374, AND 405 OF THE GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR

WHEREAS, the Borough Council, in response to inquiries from the Public Safety Committee, conducted a review of the Borough Code as it relates to the Stone Harbor Police Department's ability and authority to address offenses and/or situations occurring within the Borough that represent a breach of peace to the community; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council has determined that the purposes of the aforesaid code sections would be advanced by providing clarification regarding the same; and deems it to be in the best interest of the Borough employees, the citizens of Stone Harbor and the general public welfare to amend the within ordinance to permanently supplement the aforesaid code section as previously adopted;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council, the Governing Body of the Borough of Stone Harbor, New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 134 governing "Alcoholic Beverages" is hereby amended at §134-12 and §134-16 to include the following language in those subsections regarding violations:

"A violation of this section, in combination with conduct by the offender that either causes terror and/or alarm to others, incites violence, hinders of obstructs any Borough employee in performance of its duties, is unreasonable load and/or boisterous, offends the sensibilities of the public given the time and pace of the conduct, and/or otherwise has a deleterious impact on public order, shall constitute a breach of the peace."

<u>Section 2.</u> Chapter 156 governing "Paid Beaches" is hereby amended at §156-8 to include the following language regarding violations:

"A violation of this section, in combination with conduct by the offender that either causes terror and/or alarm to others, incites violence, hinders of obstructs any Borough employee in performance of its duties, is unreasonable load and/or boisterous, offends the sensibilities of the public given the time and pace of the conduct, and/or otherwise has a deleterious impact on public order, shall constitute a breach of the peace."

<u>Section 3.</u> Chapter 162 governing "Bicycles, Skateboards, Roller-Sakes and Segways" is hereby amended at §162-12 is hereby amended to include the following language regarding violations:

"A violation of this section, in combination with conduct by the offender that either causes terror and/or alarm to others, incites violence, hinders of obstructs any Borough employee in performance of its duties, is unreasonable load and/or boisterous, offends the sensibilities of the public given the time and pace of the conduct, and/or otherwise has a deleterious impact on public order, shall constitute a breach of the peace."

<u>Section 4.</u> Chapter 241 governing "Curfew" is hereby amended at §241-4 to include the following language regarding violations:

"A violation of this section, in combination with conduct by the offender that either causes terror and/or alarm to others, incites violence, hinders of obstructs any Borough employee in performance of its duties, is unreasonable load and/or boisterous, offends the sensibilities of the public given the time and pace of the conduct, and/or otherwise has a deleterious impact on public order, shall constitute a breach of the peace."

Section 5. Chapter 357 governing "Littering" is hereby amended at §357-10 to include the following language regarding violations:

"A violation of this section, in combination with conduct by the offender that either causes terror and/or alarm to others, incites violence, hinders of obstructs any Borough employee in performance of its duties, is unreasonable load and/or boisterous, offends the sensibilities of the public given the time and pace of the conduct, and/or otherwise has a deleterious impact on public order, shall constitute a breach of the peace."

Section 6. Chapter 363 governing "Loitering" is hereby amended at §363-5 to include the following language regarding violations:

"A violation of this section, in combination with conduct by the offender that either causes terror and/or alarm to others, incites violence, hinders of obstructs any Borough employee in performance of its duties, is unreasonable load and/or boisterous, offends the sensibilities of the public given the time and pace of the conduct, and/or otherwise has a deleterious impact on public order, shall constitute a breach of the peace."

Section 7. Chapter 374 governing "Noise" is hereby amended at §374-11(B) to include the following language:

"A violation of this section, in combination with conduct by the offender that either causes terror and/or alarm to others, incites violence, hinders of obstructs any Borough employee in performance of its duties, is unreasonable load and/or boisterous, offends the sensibilities of the public given the time and pace of the conduct, and/or otherwise has a deleterious impact on public order, shall constitute a breach of the peace."

Section 8. Chapter 405 governing "Peace and Good Order" is hereby amended at §405-4, §405-7 and §405-9 to include the following language regarding violations:

"A violation of this section, in combination with conduct by the offender that either causes terror and/or alarm to others, incites violence, hinders of obstructs any Borough employee in performance of its duties, is unreasonable load and/or boisterous, offends the sensibilities of the public given the time and pace of the conduct, and/or otherwise has a deleterious impact on public order, shall constitute a breach of the peace."

Section 9. If any portion of this ordinance is determined to be invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, that determination shall have no effect upon the remainder of this Ordinance, which shall remain valid and operable.

Section 10. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance, to the extent of such inconsistencies only, are hereby repealed

Section 11. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and p

WHEREAS, the Planning Board adopted a Resolution of Approval on April 24, 2023 at its regular meeting, amending the Master Plan to include the MPAP Element (N.J.S.A. 40:55D-29b(17)) in accordance with New Jersey Municipal Land Use Law subject to Article 3- Master Plan, N.J.S.A. 40:55D-28 and Article 11-Periodic Reexamination of Municipal Plans and Regulations, N.J.S.A. 40:55D-89; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the, Borough Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, the "Borough of Stone Harbor Municipal Public Access Plan," a copy of which is attached, is hereby approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED a copy of the plan shall be sent to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection for review and approval in accordance with N.J.A.C. 7.7.

DESIGNATED PROTECTED BATHING BEACHES – 2023

WHEREAS, the Borough of Stone Harbor periodically receives reports from its Borough Beach Patrol Captain and Borough lifeguards relating to the proper location of bathing beaches in the Borough of Stone Harbor; and

WHEREAS, the information submitted to Mayor and Council for the year 2009 is that some changes to the distribution of bathing beaches should be made.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Members of Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey that pursuant to Section 156-5 (B) of the Revised General Ordinances 2005 of the Borough of Stone Harbor, protected beaches shall be located at 8lst Street, 83rd Street, 86th Street, 87th Street, 90th Street, 93rd Street, 94th Street, 95th Street, 96th Street, 100th Street, 102nd Street, 103rd Street, 105th Street, 108th Street, 110th Street, 112th Street, 113th Street, 116th Street, 117th Street, 120th Street and 122nd Street. Additionally, the lifeguard captain, or his designated assistant, shall have the right during operations on a daily basis to move each bathing beach up to one-half block in either direction in order to take advantage of the best local conditions at the beach site. The lifeguard captain or his designated assistant, may also close a beach due to adverse weather conditions or lack of personnel, or for any other appropriate reason.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the use of surfboards (with leashes attached) shall be permitted at the beaches at 8lst Street (no swimming) and ll0th Street (no swimming) only, and all surfers shall be required to comply with the directions of the lifeguards based upon local conditions at the time. Also, the use of stand up paddleboards (with leashes attached) shall be permitted at 81st street only, and all users of stand up paddle boards shall be required to comply with the directions of the lifeguards based upon local conditions at the time. Kayaks and NJ Registered Catamarans will be permitted at 122nd Street through 126th Street only, and life jackets must be worn at all times while in the water.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that rafts and body boards (not surfboards) shall be permitted at all protected beaches, except 8lst, 86th, 110th, 112th and 122nd Streets.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that selected protected beaches shall begin to open on the Saturday of Memorial Day week-end and shall be open through the Monday of Labor Day week-end. Post-season protected beaches will be open only if qualified personnel are available.
