<u>HEARING OF THE PUBLIC ON MEMORIALS, RESOLUTIONS, PETITIONS & COMPLAINTS</u>

Geoff Woolery - SHPOA: Reviewed the cancellation of the Clean Ocean Action Spring Beach Sweep. Mr. Woolery noted that the fall event was cancelled as well. He is requesting that the borough consider rescheduling this for April 22, 2023 – Earth Day. He explained the importance of cleaning the debris from dunes and the need to be cautious with the nesting birds. Mr. Woolery will be working with Jenny to provide proper notification to anyone wishing to participate. Mr. Woolery is aware of the request for rescheduling from Clean Ocean Action for April 15, 2023. He indicated that he has communicated with Clean Ocean Action, and they have confirmed that any waivers/insurance requirements for a different date are acceptable.

Jack Vizzard – Representing parents/brother @ 9905 Second Avenue: Regarding comments presented by Mr. Karavan in the work session. A handout was presented to Mayor and Council regarding a lawsuit that the borough was included in. Mr. Vizzard proceeded with noting that this lawsuit could present an unnecessary cost to taxpayers. He asked the council why there wasn't a motion to dismiss. Mr. Karavan responded that he has discussed at length the brief that Mr. Vizzard circulated which was prepared by Mr. Belasco. There are concerns relative to certain issues and both parties feel that the borough should be doing something different. Permission to access the property was denied. Dispositive motions will be filed. It is the Borough's goal to get clarity on their role in this matter. Mr. Vizzard asked for more details on the nuances surrounding this case. Mr. Karavan said that this is a litigated matter and comments should be addressed by the court. Mr. Vizzard continued asking questions and Mr. Karavan insisted that this matter no longer be discussed. Mr. Vizzard continued and asked the borough to file a motion to dismiss. Mr. Vizzard indicated that he will be formally asking for an investigation of Mr. Karavan.

Pete Miner – 114 Gravel Hole Rd, Cape May Court House: Representing the Reed's – Thanked Mayor and Council for taking comments from previous meeting regarding beach wedding ceremonies.

No further comments were made. Mayor Davies-Dunhour Closed Public Comment.

ORDINANCE 1628 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR, CHAPTER 174 ENTITLED "BRUSH, GRASS, WEEDS & DEBRIS" TO INCLUDE PROHIBITION OF INVASIVE SPECIES

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:48-2.13, the Borough is authorized to enact ordinances requiring the destruction and removal of brush, weeds, stumps, roots and other vegetative growth where necessary to preserve the public health, safety and general welfare; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:48-2 the Borough is authorized to enact ordinances for the protection of person and property and for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the municipality and its inhabitants; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor has deemed it in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare to amend Chapter 174 of the Borough Code to regulate the growth of bamboo and other invasive species.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, County of Cape May and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION I. Chapter 174 of the Code of the Borough of Stone Harbor, entitled "Brush, Grass, Weeds & Debris" is hereby amended to add the following Section 174A as follows:

Added Section:

174A. Planting, Growing or Cultivating Bamboo and Other Invasive Plant Species

- § 174A-1. Purpose. The article is adopted to control the planting, cultivating, and/or growing of bamboo and other invasive plant species in the Borough of Stone Harbor. It is further intended to require barriers that will prevent the spread of invasive plant species, into other public or private property in the Borough of Stone Harbor.
- § 174A-2. Definition "Invasive." All native and non-native vines and vegetation that grow out of place and are competitive, persistent and detrimental; those plants may damage trees, vegetation, sidewalks or structures.
- § 174A-3. Prohibition. No landscaper, contractor, owner, tenant or occupant of a property, or a person, corporation or other entity, shall plant, install, or cause or permit the planting or installation of any invasive or nuisance plants or vegetation within any lot and/or parcel of ground anywhere within the Borough.
- § 174A-4. Duty to Confine. If there exists any invasive species located upon any property within the Borough of Stone Harbor prior to the effective date of this article, there shall be a duty to confine imposed upon the owner and occupant of the property. The duty to confine shall require owners and occupants to prevent the encroachment, spread, invasion or intrusion of bamboo and other invasive plant species onto any other private property, public property or public right-of-way.
 - § 174A-5. Notification to Confine. In the event it is determined that there is an encroachment or invasion on any adjoining private or public property or public right of way, the Borough shall notify the property owner in writing that the bamboo or other invasive plant species has invaded other private or public property or public right of way. The property owner shall have forty-five (45) days from the date of the notice to confine or remove the invasive plant(s).

§ 174A-6. Violations and penalties.

a) Any landscaper, contractor, owner, or occupant of a property who violates § 174A-3 above shall be subject to a fine of \$100 for a first offense, \$250 for a second offense, and \$500 for a third or subsequent offense. For purposes of this article, each day on which such a condition exists after the expiration of the notice shall be deemed or constitute a separate offense under this article, and separate complaints may be filed for each such offense.

- b) If the property owner does not comply with the requirements of § 174A-5 above within the forty-five (45) day notification period, the property owner shall be subject to a fine of \$100 for a first offense, \$250 for a second offense, and \$500 for a third or subsequent offense. For purposes of this article, each day on which such a condition exists after the expiration of the notice shall be deemed or constitute a separate offense under this article, and separate complaints may be filed for each such offense.
- c) When a violation as referenced in this Chapter occurs upon public property or a public right-of-way, at its discretion, the Borough of Stone Harbor may remove or contract for the removal of such invasive plant species from the public property right-of-way. The cost of such removal shall be the responsibility of the owner and occupant of the property from which the invasive plant species originated.

The cost of said removal of the invasive plant species from the public property and/or a public right-of-way may include the cost of the installation of an appropriate barrier to prevent further encroachment by the invasive plant species.

SECTION II. Severability. If for any reason any section of this Ordinance shall be declared illegal by any Court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining section of the Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect, notwithstanding.

SECTION III. Repealer. Any Ordinance or provision thereof inconsistent with this Ordinance is hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION IV. Publication. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon the adoption and publication in accordance with the law.

ORDINANCE 1633 – AMENDING THE GENERAL CODE TO REPEAL CHAPTER 300 "FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION" TO ADOPT A NEW CHAPTER 300 ENTITLED "FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION"

"SUMMARY ONLY"

Based on recommendations from FEMA and the NJDEP, the Council of Stone Harbor is proposing adopting revisions to Chapter 300 Flood Damage Prevention

The entire Chapter has been reformatted based on the NJDEP guidance to meet current FEMA NFIP requirements. There is no change in the technical requirements of this chapter except for the following items:

- 1. Freeboard is being changed to three feet.
- 2. Establishing lowest floor elevation of Elevation 12 NAVD 1988
- 3. Fees: Flood Prevention permit Fee \$200 for any work completed that exceeds \$10,000.
- 4. A Professional Engineer or Registered Architect must prepare foundation permit plans for all construction.
- 5. Deed restriction must be recorded to must explain and disclose that:
 - 1. The enclosure is likely to be inundated by floodwaters which may result in damage and/or inconvenience.
 - 2. The depth of flooding that the enclosure would experience to the Flood Hazard Area Design Flood Elevation;
 - 3. The deed restriction prohibits habitation of the enclosure and explains that converting the enclosure into a habitable area may subject the property owner to enforcement;
- 6. Flood Compliance Certificate is required for all residential dwelling units including one-family, two-family, three-family, and multiple-family, and individual condominium and cooperative units contained therein prior to the transfer of title of a residential dwelling. Flood Compliance Certificate fee is \$50.
