## **COMMUNICATIONS**

## **Public Comment:**

**Fay Givler, 14 97<sup>th</sup> Street-** Ms. Givler states her concerns regarding illegal citizens traveling through the Atlantic City airport and coming to Stone Harbor and inhabiting non year-round residential properties. Police Chief Schutta confirms his department along with the county and state, are monitoring this issue closely. Ms. Givler states the audible emergency public service announcements are difficult to understand.

**Jerry Quinn, 8600 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue-** Mr. Quinn states his concerns of neighboring properties being on different ground levels and how water would be contained and urges Council to change these regulations.

**Suzanne Walters, 115 92<sup>nd</sup> Street-** Ms. Walters welcomes the newly appointed clerk and states the Jersey Shore Partnership meeting and reception will be relocated from the Women's Civic Club to the Yacht Club. Ms. Walters questions the barricades on 112<sup>th</sup> Street as it was understood to be public parking but there are signs stating no trespassing. Mr. Parada confirms the street has not been dedicated to the Borough yet. Ms. Walters comments on the proposed ordinance 1657 and states if the purpose is to promote open space and air then Council should consider prohibiting anything being constructed in the existing setbacks.

**Ray Parzych, 9925 Sunset Drive-** Mr. Parzych states he fully supports the introduction of ordinance 1657 and passing this ordinance would promote the attractiveness of the borough and increase property value.

**Jeff Woolery, 217 110**<sup>th</sup> **Street-** Mr. Woolery states he supports ordinance 1657 regarding the changes to the setbacks, which focuses on the future of the Borough. Mr. Woolery also suggests Council consider limiting the amount of items constructed in the setbacks.

**John Hunter**, **416 104**<sup>th</sup> **Street-** Mr. Hunter states he is in opposition to the lot grading and that it only benefits some property owners.

Mary Catherine, 111 107<sup>th</sup> Street- Ms. Catherine states her full support for introducing ordinance 1657 as residents are encroaching on neighbors.

**Judy Hammerschmidt (via Zoom)-** Ms. Hammerschmidt questions how the zoning office will be handling applications that have already been submitted pertaining to the new ordinances that are intended to be introduced tonight. City Solicitor Marcus Karavan responds stating Council intends to discuss this topic in closed session and plans to have a response that will be made publicly.
