AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 178  
OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES  
OF THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR 2005  
(ADDING TO DUMPSTER LANGUAGE)

**Section 1.** Chapter 178 is hereby amended as follows:

[add the following language to the 178-20 (B)]

B. A construction site dumpster shall be of sufficient size to accommodate all construction debris and trash and refuse accumulated at the construction site subject to the limitation as hereinabove described. The dumpster shall be equipped with a cover, and the dumpster shall be covered as appropriate, and must be covered between the hours of 6:00 pm and 6:00 am prevailing time and during such periods of time that no representative of the permittee is present at the location, so as to prevent any construction debris, trash or other refuse from escaping and/or becoming scattered throughout the general neighborhood or on the construction site. The covering for the dumpster must be of sufficient size and made of such material to prevent the cover from blowing off due to wind or other elements. The surface on which dumpster will be placed shall be protected. A sufficient amount of plywood shall be placed on surface where underside of dumpster makes contact with surface to displace weight and protect surface.

**Section 2.** If any portion of this ordinance is determined to be invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, that determination shall have no effect upon the remainder of this Ordinance, which shall remain valid and operable.

**Section 3.** All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance, to the extent of such inconsistencies only, be and the same are hereby repealed.

**Section 4.** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon publication as provided by law.

## HIGH WHEEL VEHICLE SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR AND COUNTY OF CAPE MAY

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into on the 1<sup>ST</sup> day of July, 2014, by and between:

### **BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR**

A Municipal Corporation of the State of New Jersey with offices located at:

hereinafter referred to as "Municipality";

And the: **COUNTY OF CAPE MAY**

A Body Politic and Corporate of the State of New Jersey with offices located at:

William E. Sturm Jr. Administration Building

4 Moore Road

Cape May Court House, New Jersey 08210

hereinafter referred to as the "County".

**WHEREAS**, the County has experienced numerous events such as; Tropical Depression, Nor'Easters, Hurricanes, Winter Snow Storms that require evacuations in such conditions such as Flood Waters, Severe Snow Storms or obstructed Highways where High Wheel All Terrain Vehicles are required. The County has developed a High Wheel Vehicle Strike Team.

**WHEREAS**, the County has been obtaining High Wheel Military Vehicles hereinafter referred to as "High Wheel Vehicle" from the United States Department of Defense Logistics Agency; and

**WHEREAS**, the High Wheel Vehicle as identified in 'Schedule A' was obtained with the intent to be better prepared for emergencies or disasters may be used in the various municipalities within the County; and

**WHEREAS**, the Municipality has identified a need to have a high wheel vehicle in their municipality that can be used in the event of an emergency or disaster; and

**WHEREAS**, the Municipality has a desire to enter into an agreement with the County to use the high wheel vehicle and to be part of the High Wheel Strike Team; and

**WHEREAS**, NJSA 401:65-1 et.seq. authorizes local government units, including municipalities and counties, to enter into agreements for the exchange of services pursuant to the provisions of that statute known as the "Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act";

**NOW, THEREFORE**, it is agreed, stipulated and understood between parties, in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein as follows:

1. All of the above recitals are incorporated herein by reference as it fully set forth at length.
2. The County is the owner of the Equipment identified in 'Schedule A'.
3. The Municipality hereby agrees to indemnify the County and to hold it harmless from and against any and all damages, claims, losses and/or liabilities of any sort (including reasonable attorney's fees) which the Municipality may incur from using the County Equipment. In addition, the Municipality agrees to have the County named as an additional insured on any existing insurance contracts carried by the Municipality to provide general comprehensive liability coverage in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 dollars.  
A certificate of insurance evidencing said coverage and the additional insured designation shall be provided by the Municipality and Attached to this agreement.
4. The Municipality agrees to reimburse the County or perform the repairs themselves for any damage inflicted upon the Equipment while in the possession of the Municipality.
5. The Municipality is responsible for any servicing or re-fueling of the Equipment while in the possession of the Municipality.
6. The Municipality shall immediately return the Equipment to the County when the Equipment is rendered unusable or no longer to be used by the Municipality and or the County.
7. In the event of a dispute between the parties arising out of this Agreement, the parties agree that they will immediately meet and make a good faith effort to resolve such conflict.
8. The parties have read this Agreement. It is a full statement of their understandings. It may not be changed except in writing signed by both parties.
9. This agreement shall be governed by the laws of New Jersey with venue in the County of Cape May.
10. The term of this agreement is from July 1, 2014 to July 31, 2016. An option to renew can be exercised by both parties upon correspondence prior to the expiration date.
