Dear Ms. Stanford:

South Jersey Gas is currently working to upgrade its infrastructure in the Borough of Stone Harbor. This work is part of our Accelerated Infrastructure Replacement Program, that focuses on replacing aging bare steel infrastructure with new plastic infrastructure. This will reduce the risk of leaks and, therefore, reduce the potential for emergency openings.

This particular project involves renewing 26,293' of main, benefitting approximately 660 existing Stone Harbor customers. With this upgrade, all services will now have Excess Flow Valves which are designed to shut off the flow of natural gas in case of a service line break or excavation damage.

The main renewal project proposed by South Jersey Gas will go down 2<sup>nd</sup> Street and pass over 82<sup>nd</sup> Street, which is currently under moratorium. Three openings, approximately 3' long by 3' wide, will need to be made at the intersection of these streets to complete the installation. Additionally, two openings, approximately 5' long by 5' wide will need to be made at 3<sup>rd</sup> Street and 82<sup>nd</sup> Street in order to maintain the natural gas feed on 82<sup>nd</sup> Street. As is anticipated with this type of construction, additional openings may need to be made depending on other utilities in these locations.

We respectfully request the permission of Borough Council to open these areas so that we may complete the project and offer our customers more reliable service. Should our request be granted South Jersey Gas will repave, in accordance with Borough standards, the section on 2<sup>nd</sup> Street and 82<sup>nd</sup> Street, as we will have a continuous mill and pave on 2<sup>nd</sup> that will encompass any openings in the intersection. South Jersey Gas will also repave, in accordance with Borough standards, the section on 3<sup>rd</sup> Street and 82<sup>nd</sup> Street to cover those openings.

Thank you in advance for your prompt attention to our request.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 542 (Water and Sewers)  
OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES  
OF THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR 2005

Chapter 542. Water and Sewers

§ 542-7. Owner's responsibility for water services.

~~The entire water service system from the water main. The water service line from the meter pit to all outlets in the premises is the sole responsibility of the owner of the premises, and shall be kept in repair or replaced at the owner's expense. All repairs to the water service line from the curb to the water main, where negligence is not a factor, shall be the responsibility of the Borough. Application to upgrade Meters, meter boxes, fittings and pipes, which require mandatory maintenance or upgrading, will be subject to the applicable charges found in § 542-5 and/or § 542-6 hereof.~~

§ 542-11 Turnoff charges; final reading charges.

~~A turnoff charge of \$250 will be made if the Utilities Department has effected a temporary turnoff of the water service, either at the request of the customer or because of an emergency, or because the Utilities Department turned off the water service by reason of a violation of any of the sections of this chapter. A second subsequent turnoff hereunder will result in the imposition by the Borough of a charge of \$500. Each subsequent turnoff will result in the imposition by the Borough of a charge of \$750. Service may only be restored by a licensed New Jersey plumber.~~

~~An annual maintenance fee of \$10.00 per meter will be added to the water service bill. This fee will offset any necessary repairs and/or mandatory upgrades to the water service infrastructure within the Borough~~

§ 542-16 Owner's responsibility for sanitary collection system.

It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner to maintain the entire building sewer in proper operating condition. Restrictions in the building sewer causing limited flow, blockage or discharge of sewage onto any property, into the street, highway or within an easement area, shall be eliminated through arrangements between the property owner and a registered plumber. ~~If the Utilities Department is dispatched to a property and it is determined that the restriction is not within the sewer lateral from the curb to the main a charge of \$250.00 will be imposed upon the property owner.~~ It is illegal for any vent system to discharge sewage onto any property, whether public or private. If such discharges do occur, the cause must be promptly eliminated. Tardy elimination or frequently repeated occasions of such incidences or failure to clean up after such instances shall be a violation of this chapter and shall be reason for the Stone Harbor Board of Health or the Stone Harbor Plumbing Inspector to cause discontinuance of water service and to proceed with necessary arrangements for clean up, etc., and assess the user accordingly.

## RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION ALLOWING THE WALKING OF DOGS (ON LEASHES) ON THE BEACH BETWEEN 80<sup>TH</sup> AND 122<sup>ND</sup> STREETS FROM 7:00 PM UNTIL SUNSET

WHEREAS, in accordance with R.G.O. 147-H(3), the Borough Council is empowered to allow, by Resolution, the walking of dogs on the beach as designated by said ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, duly assembled in public session this 15<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2018, as follows:

1. The walking of dogs under leash on the beach shall be permitted upon the public portion of the beach between 80<sup>th</sup> and 122<sup>nd</sup> Streets effective June 1, 2018, through September 30, 2018.
2. The time for the walking of dogs shall be 7 pm until the time of Sunset as published in the Press of Atlantic City, each day of the term of this Resolution.
3. This allowance is in the sole discretion of the Borough Council and may be repealed by subsequent Resolution of Borough Council. Additionally, the Chief of Police, upon the request of the Captain of the Lifeguards or on his own initiative, shall have the power to disallow such dog walking if he determines such disallowance is in the interest of public safety.
4. Any person allowing a dog to be upon the beach without being leashed, in the area designated above, continues to be subject to the provisions of R.G.O. 147.
5. Immediate cleanup and proper disposal of waste is mandatory.
6. No dog or other animal shall be permitted, at any time, whether under leash or running free, in the area south of the 127<sup>th</sup> street jetty to Herford Inlet.

**ESTABLISHING WAGE RATES FOR BEACH PATROL  
AND BEACH TAG PERSONNEL**

WHEREAS, the Borough of Stone Harbor maintains a Beach Patrol for the protection of the health, safety and welfare of beach-goers during the summer season and also maintains a contingent of beach tag personnel in order to enforce the Borough's beach tag ordinance and provide convenient points of sale of beach tags to visitors; and

WHEREAS, the Beach and Recreation Committee of Borough Council have determined that it is in the best interests of the Borough to provide a more competitive wage scheduled, complete with certain incentives, in order to continue to attract qualified and committed persons to serve as lifeguards on the Borough's beaches:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, duly assembled in public session this 15<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2018 as follows:

1. That the preamble of this Resolution is hereby incorporated herein by reference;
2. That members of the Beach Patrol be compensated for work during the 2018 season in accordance with the following schedule:

3. That beach tag personnel be paid in accordance with the following schedule:

Beach Tag Checkers and Office Staff

Range: \$9.50/hour - \$16.00/hour (returnees automatically receive additional .50/hour)

BONUSES: Taggers will receive an additional .40 for every tag sold. s.

4. That the provisions of this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon passage and shall be subject to the continuing review of the Beach and Recreation Committee and may be modified, in the sole discretion of the Borough Council, as deemed appropriate from time to time.

## DESIGNATED PROTECTED BATHING BEACHES – 2018

WHEREAS, the Borough of Stone Harbor periodically receives reports from its Borough Beach Patrol Captain and Borough lifeguards relating to the proper location of bathing beaches in the Borough of Stone Harbor; and

WHEREAS, the information submitted to Mayor and Council for the year 2009 is that some changes to the distribution of bathing beaches should be made.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Members of Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey that pursuant to Section 156-5 (B) of the Revised General Ordinances 2005 of the Borough of Stone Harbor, protected beaches shall be located at 81st Street, 83rd Street, 86th Street, 87th Street, 90th Street, 93rd Street, 94<sup>th</sup> Street, 95th Street, 96th Street, 100th Street, 102nd Street, 103rd Street, 105th Street, 108th Street, 110th Street, 112<sup>th</sup> Street, 113<sup>th</sup> Street, 116th Street, 117th Street, 120th Street and 122<sup>nd</sup> Street. Additionally, the lifeguard captain, or his designated assistant, shall have the right during operations on a daily basis to move each bathing beach up to one-half block in either direction in order to take advantage of the best local conditions at the beach site. The lifeguard captain or his designated assistant, may also close a beach due to adverse weather conditions or lack of personnel, or for any other appropriate reason.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the use of surfboards (with leashes attached) shall be permitted at the beaches at 81st Street (no swimming) and 110th Street (no swimming) only, and all surfers shall be required to comply with the directions of the lifeguards based upon local conditions at the time. Also, the use of stand up paddleboards (with leashes attached) shall be permitted at 81<sup>st</sup> street only, and all users of stand up paddle boards shall be required to comply with the directions of the lifeguards based upon local conditions at the time. Kayaks and NJ Registered Catamarans will be permitted at 122nd Street through 126th Street only, and life jackets must be worn at all times while in the water.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that rafts and body boards (not surfboards) shall be permitted at all protected beaches, except 81st, 86<sup>th</sup>, 105<sup>th</sup>, (taken out, making it a rafting beach/per Sandy) 110<sup>th</sup>, 112<sup>th</sup> and 122<sup>nd</sup> Streets.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that selected protected beaches shall begin to open on the Saturday of Memorial Day week-end and shall be open through the Monday of Labor Day week-end. Post-season protected beaches will be open only if qualified personnel are available.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that beach tags shall be required for all beaches commencing on the Saturday of Memorial Day week-end thru the Monday of Labor Day week-end.

WHEREAS, the authorizing agreement was approved by both Municipalities in 1988 and some changes were requested in 2015; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Borough of Stone Harbor to authorize the execution of an amended Agreement with the Borough of Avalon.

EMERGENCY WATER INTERCONNECTION AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made this 15<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2018, by and between the BOROUGH OF AVALON, a municipal corporation of the State of New Jersey, with offices located at 3100 Dune Drive, Avalon, New Jersey and the BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR, a municipal corporation of the State of New Jersey with offices located at 9508 Second Avenue Stone Harbor, NJ.

WHEREAS, the two municipalities previously constructed an interconnection between their mutually independent water systems and in accordance with plans for the interconnection had been prepared by Killam Associates; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to renew the Agreement as provided herein.

THEREFOR, it is hereby agreed by and between the Borough of Avalon and the Borough of Stone Harbor as follows:

1. The interconnections shall be available for emergency use by both parties. An emergency shall be defined as an abnormal condition due to equipment failures, water main breaks, power outages, loss of storage facility, or other unforeseen circumstances which prevent one party's water system from meeting demands through its normal supply sources and create a temporary need for transfer of water from the other party's system.
2. Upon occurrence of an emergency, the water superintendent or authorized representative of the party requiring water shall contact the water superintendent or authorized representative of the other party. Authorized representatives of both parties shall meet and activate the interconnection by opening the appropriate valves, and shall record the meter readings. The metered interconnection shall only be activated and subsequently deactivated in the presence both water superintendents or their designees.
3. Emergency transfer of water from either party shall be subject to availability of water in the system supplying the water. Neither party guarantees the amount or pressure of available water.
4. When the interconnection is not in use for an actual emergency, valves on both sides of the interconnection meter pit shall be kept closed.
5. The interconnection shall be metered in both directions. When an emergency transfer of water from either party is made, the receiving party shall pay to the supplying party an amount agreed upon by the parties hereto annually in December, to take effect on January 1<sup>st</sup> of the following year. This charge for the balance of 2018 shall be \$2.25 per thousand gallons.
6. The meter pit and meter shall be owned and maintained by both parties. Both parties shall have access to the meter pit for testing and inspection. Water mains, valves and hydrants within Avalon shall be owned and maintained by Avalon. Water mains, valves and hydrants within Stone Harbor shall be owned and maintained by Stone Harbor. Once each year the water superintendent or authorized representative of both parties shall conduct an inspection and test of the interconnection. This test and inspection shall be conducted in the presence of both parties. Cost of maintenance and repair shall be shared by both parties. A report discussing the results of the test and conditions of the interconnection shall be prepared by both water superintendents and filed with both parties and submitted to the NJDEP in accordance with applicable regulations.
7. The cost of the initial construction for the installation of the interconnection has been shared by the parties hereto on an equal basis and the cost of maintenance of the interconnection shall also be shared on an equal basis.

**RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF FIBRODYSPLASIA OSSIFICANS PROGRESSIVA AWARENESS**

WHEREAS, Fibrodysplasia Ossificans Progressiva (FOP) is a rare genetic condition in which the body makes additional bone in locations where bone should not form, such as within muscles, tendons, ligaments and other connective tissues, which in time produces a "second skeleton" that immobilizes the joints of the body; and

WHEREAS, one in every seven Americans suffer from musculoskeletal impairment causing physical disability and severe long-term pain; and

WHEREAS, the symptoms of FOP usually begin in the first or second decade of life, with the majority of patients diagnosed by the age of 10 depriving children of normal development; and

WHEREAS, FOP is considered an orphan disease whereby it affects so few people and there are less than 12 diagnosed cases in New Jersey and approximately 200 in the nation; and

WHEREAS, musculoskeletal research is close to achieving major breakthroughs that likely will change and simplify the way bone and joint disorders are treated and prevented throughout the world; and

WHEREAS, there is a need for greater awareness of this disorder, its symptoms and the obstacles faced by persons and families affected by this disorder.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, Cape May County and State of New Jersey, hereby applaud and recognize Gary W. Whyte as an outstanding individual for his tenacious drive to support and help so many within the community for the awareness of Fibrodysplasia Ossificans Progressiva (FOP) and urge the medical community to continue researching for treatment and a cure for this rare genetic disorder.




