ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 134 OF THE GENERAL
ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR SPECIFICALLY
ARTICLE 134-9 and 134-10

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, New Jersey Governor Philip Murphy issued Executive Order 103 declaring a State of Emergency and a Public Health Emergency in response to the outbreak of the novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) within the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States of America, Donald J. Trump, formally declared the outbreak of the novel Coronavirus to constitute a National Emergency pursuant to the National Emergencies Act (50 U.S.C. § 1601, et seq.); and

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, Governor Murphy issued Executive Order 104 enacting several "social distancing" regulations, including but not limited to, limiting public gatherings to no more than 50 people, closing educational facilities, closing various recreation and entertainment based businesses, imposed restrictions on scope of service and hours of operation for other non-essential retail, recreational, restaurant/bars and entertainment businesses; and

WHEREAS, on March 21, 2020, Governor Murphy issued Executive Order 107 which expanded the social distancing regulations set forth within Executive Order 104, including but not limited to, directing all New Jersey residents to remain in their home or place of residence with specific limited exceptions, prohibited gatherings of any size, closed all non-essential retail businesses and identified essential businesses permitted to continue to operate subject to specific limitations, and reiterated and strengthened social distancing requirements when in public; and

WHEREAS, on March 21, 2020, Governor Murphy also issued Executive Order 108 which specifically voided and precluded County and Municipal Governments from imposing or enforcing any restrictions/regulations that in any way would or might conflict with any of the provisions of Executive Order 107, with the exception of regulating online marketplaces for arranging or offering lodging, municipal or county parks, and beaches and boardwalks; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 107 specifically regulated the continued operation of Bars/Restaurants and provides, in part, that "All restaurants, cafeterias, dining establishments, and food courts, with or without a liquor license, all bars, and all other holders of a liquor license with retail consumption privileges, are permitted to operate their normal business hours, but are limited to offering only food delivery and/or take-out services in accordance with their existing liquor licenses;" and

WHEREAS, in the anticipation that the regulations, prohibitions and social distancing requirements within the Governor's Executive Orders being relaxed and/or modified in the coming weeks or months, potentially permitting the aforementioned business establishments to operate at reduced capacities, the governing body of the Borough of Stone Harbor by Ordinance 1568, introduced May 5, 2020, to temporarily relax the procedures associated with site plan review and approval in order to permit retail food and beverage service establishments to locate tables out-of-doors, in the Borough right-of-way and/or in other locations on site, and

WHEREAS, Section 134-10 of the Code of the Borough of Stone Harbor, in part provides:

"It is hereby declared unlawful to carry, display or otherwise transport any alcoholic beverage on, over or along any public street or parking lot as defined above, or on any public property of the Borough. This shall not prohibit transporting alcoholic beverages on any public street or parking lot when the container is wrapped or otherwise covered, or when the container is contained within a box, wrapper or carton packaged in that manner for sale to the public." and

WHEREAS, many of the food service establishments that could benefit from the relaxation of site plan review and approval procedures also are establishments licensed for the retail sale of alcoholic beverages; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council is in the process of adopting Ordinance Number _____, introduced May 5, 2020 in order to stimulate commerce within the Borough during the re-opening of the County of Cape May subsequent to the COVID 19 economic shut down; and

WHEREAS, in order to relax the restrictions in Chapter 134 of the Code of the Borough of Stone Harbor regarding the consumption of alcoholic beverages and the possession of opened containers of alcoholic beverages it is necessary that the provisions of Chapter 134 of the Code of the Borough of Stone Harbor be amended so as to allow for such relaxation and it is the intent and purpose of this ordinance to provide for such an amendment;

NOW, THEREFORE be it ordained by the Borough Council, the Governing Body of the Borough of Stone Harbor, New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 134, Article 134-9 (Part A), is hereby amended to read as follows:

- A. The consumption of any alcoholic beverages in public is prohibited; however, the foregoing notwithstanding, Borough Council may amend or suspend, in whole or in part, the foregoing restrictions subject to the provisions herein, by resolution, as circumstances in the Borough may warrant.

Section 2. Article 134-10 shall be and is hereby amended to include the following additional verbiage:

The foregoing notwithstanding, it shall be permissible, during the period that Ordinance ~~1548~~, that relaxes zoning regulations and site plan regulations concerning outdoor seating for the service of food by establishments which hold a valid mercantile license for the service of food on an eat-in or take out basis, remains in effect, the foregoing restrictions contained in this section may be suspended, in whole or in part, or otherwise modified by Resolution of Borough Council upon the advice of the Director of Public Safety and the Stone Harbor Emergency Management Coordinator.

Upon adoption of such a Resolution, the Municipal Clerk shall cause copies to be posted up on the Clerk's bulletin board in Borough Hall, upon the Borough Internet website and it to cause notice of adoption of the Resolution to be published in the Borough's official Newspaper.

Section 3. If any portion of this ordinance is determined to be invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, that determination shall have no effect upon the remainder of this Ordinance, which shall remain valid and operable.

Section 4. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance, to the extent of such inconsistencies only, are hereby repealed.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as provided by law.

Resolution Authorizing the Municipal Tax Collector to prepare and mail Estimated Tax Bills

In accordance with P.L. 1994, c 72

WHEREAS, due to the late adoption of the State of New Jersey's budget the County Board of Taxation is unable to certify the tax rate and the municipal Tax Collector will be unable to mail the tax bills on a timely basis; and,

WHEREAS, the municipal Tax Collector in consultation with the municipal Chief Financial Officer has computed an estimated tax levy in accordance with N.J.S.A. 54:4-66.3, and they have signed a certification showing the tax levies for the previous year, the tax rates and the range of permitted estimated tax levies; and,

WHEREAS, in accordance with Chapter 72 P.L. 1994, the Borough Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey does not need the Director of the Division of Local Government Services to approve the estimated tax levy listed on the attached Schedule A, which will enable the municipality to meet its financial obligations, maintain the tax collection rate, provide uniformity for tax payments and save the unnecessary cost of interest expenses on borrowing; and,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, in the County of Cape May and the State of New Jersey on this 19th day of May 2020, as follows:

- I. The Municipal Tax collector is hereby authorized and directed to prepare, and issue estimated tax bills for the municipality for the third quarterly installment of 2020 taxes. The Tax Collector shall proceed and take such actions as permitted and required by P.L. 1994, c72 (N.J.S.A. 54:4-66.2 and 54:4-66.3).
- II. The estimated tax levy for 2020 is hereby set at \$28,805,000.00.
- III. In Accordance with law the third quarterly installment of 2020 taxes shall not be subject to interest until the later of August 10, 2020 or the twenty-fifth (25) calendar day after the estimated tax bills were mailed. The estimated tax bills shall contain a notice specifying the date which interest may begin to accrue.

Approve Proposal for Professional Engineering Services, NJDEP Water Allocation Permit for Construction Dewatering 93rd Street Stormwater Pump Station Project – Borough of Stone Harbor

WHEREAS, Mott MacDonald, 211 Bayberry Drive, Suite 1A, Cape May Court House, N.J. 08210 has prepared a Proposal (copy attached) to provide NJDEP Water Allocation Permit for Construction DeWATERing for the 93rd Street Stormwater Pump Station Project ; and

WHEREAS, SCOPE OF WORK AND COST PROPOSAL

- Review available published data and complete hydrologic evaluations in support of project-specific BWA-002 application
- Review readily available aquifer data and well records to establish parameters to support the evaluation. Soil boring logs and laboratory test results from existing borings will be used to roughly predict the radius of influence and dewatering impact area.
- Prepare a hydrogeologic report in support of the application and provide necessary hydrogeologic data to prepare the necessary BWA-002 application form.
- Prepare supporting documentation and the required NJDEP permit applications and submit to the appropriate programs. All permit fees are assumed to be paid directly by the Borough of Stone Harbor and therefore we have not included these fees in our cost proposal. The application fees are unknown at this time and cannot be determined until the monthly allocation has been calculated. Depending on the size of the application, the permit fee could be as much as \$18,925. The Borough would be able to pay the fee in three installments pursuant to N.J.S.A. 13:1D-124.
- Coordinate with the permit programs and provide typical follow-up to department inquiries. Should the agency require significant additional submissions, we will inform the Borough of the anticipated costs prior to completion.

PROPOSAL to complete the scope of work outlined above for the lump sum amount of \$19,400.

WHEREAS, it is the intention of Council to approve this proposal as presented, upon final approval of Borough Solicitor, Borough Administrator and Certification of the CFO.

DESIGNATED PROTECTED BATHING BEACHES – 2019

WHEREAS, the Borough of Stone Harbor periodically receives reports from its Borough Beach Patrol Captain and Borough lifeguards relating to the proper location of bathing beaches in the Borough of Stone Harbor; and

WHEREAS, the information submitted to Mayor and Council for the year 2009 is that some changes to the distribution of bathing beaches should be made.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Members of Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey that pursuant to Section 156-5 (B) of the Revised General Ordinances 2005 of the Borough of Stone Harbor, protected beaches shall be located at 81st Street, 83rd Street, 86th Street, 87th Street, 90th Street, 93rd Street, 94th Street, 95th Street, 96th Street, 100th Street, 102nd Street, 103rd Street, 105th Street, 108th Street, 110th Street, 112th Street, 113th Street, 116th Street, 117th Street, 120th Street and 122nd Street. Additionally, the lifeguard captain, or his designated assistant, shall have the right during operations on a daily basis to move each bathing beach up to one-half block in either direction in order to take advantage of the best local conditions at the beach site. The lifeguard captain or his designated assistant, may also close a beach due to adverse weather conditions or lack of personnel, or for any other appropriate reason.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the use of surfboards (with leashes attached) shall be permitted at the beaches at 81st Street (no swimming) and 110th Street (no swimming) only, and all surfers shall be required to comply with the directions of the lifeguards based upon local conditions at the time. Also, the use of stand up paddleboards (with leashes attached) shall be permitted at 81st street only, and all users of stand up paddle boards shall be required to comply with the directions of the lifeguards based upon local conditions at the time. Kayaks and NJ Registered Catamarans will be permitted at 122nd Street through 126th Street only, and life jackets must be worn at all times while in the water.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that rafts and body boards (not surfboards) shall be permitted at all protected beaches, except 81st, 86th, 110th, 112th and 122nd Streets.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that selected protected beaches shall begin to open on the Saturday of Memorial Day week-end and shall be open through the Monday of Labor Day week-end. Post-season protected beaches will be open only if qualified personnel are available.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that beach tags shall be required for all beaches commencing on the Saturday of Memorial Day week-end thru the Monday of Labor Day week-end.
