The NJBPU's procurement of up to 2,400 MW of offshore wind energy will help serve the state with clean energy while continuing to develop a new American industry that will create opportunities for jobs and economic development. This solicitation request also helps to further Governor Murphy's goal of 7,500 MW of offshore wind energy by 2035.

New Jersey's coastline presents ideal conditions for the development of offshore wind.
