Dear Ms. Stanford:

This firm represents Lauren Dickerman Covington and Cynthia Dickerman (the "Applicants"), the owners of the above property, in connection with this application for a Street Opening Permit to allow the installation of a gas service line from the estisting South Jersey Gas line located along 88th Street to the above property. (As 88th Street is currently under a road opening moratorium until 2025; the Applicant is seeking this relief under a hardship condition pursuant to \$475-7(b) of the Stone Harbor Municipal Ordinance.

The Applicants recently purchased the above property and have begun construction of a new single family residence at the site. During construction of the new residence, it was discovered that the prior home was not serviced by the exisiting gas line along 88<sup>th</sup> street and no stub or service line existed to provide the new residence with natural gas. South Jersey Gas has determined that in order for the new construction to be serviced with gas the road must be opened to allow the installation of a service line.

As indicated above, 88th Street is currently under a street opening moratorium until 2025. Therefore, purusant to §475-7(b) of the Municipal Ordinance, the Applicants are seeking a Street Opening Permit under a hardship condition in order to open a portion of 88th Street to allow the necessary work to take place. Specifically, an approximately 2' x 2' utility opening is required over the water main to ensure there is no damage to existing main during installation and a approximately 4' x 4' tie-in opening to allow the proposed service line to be tied into the existing gas main.

Egg Harbor Township | Avalon

The lack of an existing gas stub or servie line for the property constitutes a classic hardship which entitles the Applicants to the requested relief. The Applicants purchased the property in January of 2021, a year after 88th Street was repayed and municipal notices were provided to property owners. Given the lack of an existing stub or service line, there is presently no way in which to service the residence with natural gas. The Applicants purchased this property and commenced construction of the new single family residence with no knowledge of the street opening moratorium. It was only as the property was roughed-in for gas service was it discovered that no service line existed and a moratorium existed for 88th Street. As the Applicants now require the installation of a service line to provide natural gas to the new single family home, a classic hardship condition exists.

The Applicant's kindly request that this Application be scheduled for the September 21, 2021-meeting of the Borough Council. The required public notice will be supplied to all property owners within 200 feet as required under the Ordinance.

#### RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR TO EXERCISE CONDEMNATION POWERS, PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 20:3-1 ET SEQ., IN CONNECTION WITH THE 93<sup>RD</sup> STREET STORMWATER PUMP STATION AND VARIOUS DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

WHEREAS, as part of its continuing duties to protect the health, safety and welfare of the residents and inhabitants of the Borough of Stone Harbor, the Borough periodically undertakes a review of the stormwater management system within the Borough;

WHEREAS, as a result of said review, the Borough determined the need for the construction of a new pump station and installation of new outfall pipes to effectively manage stormwater in the Borough and prevent flooding in residential and commercial areas, the same being identified as the 93<sup>rd</sup> Street Stormwater Pump Station and Various Drainage Improvements Project; and

WHEREAS, in order for the new outfall pipes to effectively discharge said stormwater, they must route from the drainage gates on and subsurface pipes under Borough roadways to the intracoastal waterway and back bay; and

WHEREAS, municipal engineers have determined that there are locations in the Borough where said outfall pipes must be installed in order to effectively accomplish the intent and purpose of the stormwater management project; and

WHEREAS, one of said outfall pipes will be required to encroach, albeit subsurface, on a portion of private property that is not owned by the Borough, specifically Block 90.91, Lots 156.01 and 158.01; and

WHEREAS, should said private property owner not agree to grant the Borough an easement for the installation and maintenance of said outfall pipe, the Borough maintains the power under the Eminent Domain Act, N.J.S.A. 20:3-1 et seq., and the New Jersey Constitution to condemn property as needed for a valid public purpose, and intends to exercise said commendation powers if required;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL, that the Borough of Stone Harbor is hereby authorized to exercise its condemnation powers for the purpose of obtaining an easement as required for the installation and maintenance of outfall pipes in connection with the stormwater management project.

contract, the price of which exceeds the current bid threshold, may be negotiated and awarded without public bidding if the subject matter of the contract consist of: "(gg) a contract for the provision of... a wastewater treatment system as defined in (N.J.S.A. 40A:11-15 (19) or any component part of parts thereof" and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Stone Harbor has a need to replace the obsolete 114<sup>th</sup> Street Pump Station with a new pump station to be located on 114<sup>th</sup> & Third Avenue.

WHEREAS, Said facility is a component part of the wastewater treatment system that is operated by the Borough of Stone Harbor; and

WHEREAS, Reiner Pump Systems has the credentials and ability to supply the Borough of Stone Harbor with the parts and equipment needed to provide a prefabricated pump station building and has submitted a proposal, dated August 24, 2021, indicating that it will provide the Borough of Stone Harbor with a prefabricated pump station building for a price of \$ 497,310.00; and
