

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Clean Communities Council, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, the New Jersey Department of State, policymakers, environmental and business groups, as well as other stakeholders, are working together to educate consumers, businesses, and communities about the new law and encouraging residents to "Bag Up" before the ban on single-use plastic bags goes into effect on May 4, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the comprehensive "Bag Up NJ" campaign will include educational programs, public and media engagement and reusable bag distribution programs throughout the state, with an emphasis on underserved communities; and

WHEREAS, this statewide public education campaign will provide residents, businesses and visitors with information about the types of reusable and sustainable bags and containers that they may use and where to access these products.

RESOLUTION GRANTING TAX COLLECTOR DISCRETION TO OFFER RESIDENTIAL WATER/SEWER RATEPAYERS 12 MONTH INSTALLMENT PLANS

WHEREAS, Local Finance Notice (LFN) 2022-09 and P.L. 2021, c. 317 have established various relief measures for residential ratepayers of local government water, sewer, and electric service; and,

WHEREAS, residential ratepayers having arrearages accruing between March 9, 2020 and March 15, 2022, may be offered a 12 month installment plan, subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 54:5-19, unless P.L. 2021, c. 317 states otherwise; and,

WHEREAS, the installment plan must have equal monthly payments and the residential ratepayer must make timely payments on the arrearages, and current fees and charges, including property taxes. The residential ratepayer must know the monthly payment amount for the installment plan before agreeing to the plan. If the residential ratepayer does not pay their arrearages and/or current charges within 30 days after the due date, the installment plan is void and enforcement can proceed on the unpaid arrears, including service shutoff and bringing accrued arrearages and interest and penalties accruing to tax sale. If the residential ratepayer does not agree to an installment plan within 30 days of being offered a plan, enforcement action can be taken at any time after March 15, 2022.

WHEREAS, the residential ratepayer must know the monthly payment amount for the installment plan before agreeing to the plan, and if the residential ratepayer does not pay their arrearages and/or current charges within 30 days after the due date, then the installment plan is void and enforcement can proceed on the unpaid arrears at any time after March 15, 2022, including service shutoff and bringing accrued arrearages and interest and penalties accruing after March 15, 2022 to tax sale.


