ORDINANCE 1614

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 67 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH
OF STONE HARBOR, CREATING THE POSITION OF DEPUTY BOROUGH CLERK**

WHEREAS, the Borough Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the Borough to insert into the Borough Code the position of Deputy Borough Clerk; and

WHEREAS, these changes are planned for and included in the Borough's 2022 operating budget;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, that Article 1A of Chapter 67 of the Borough Code, titled Deputy Borough Clerk, shall be created as follows:

SECTION 1. Create Position

Amend Chapter 67 by adding the following Article and Sections to create the position of Deputy Borough Clerk within the Borough Code, thereby amending the Organizational Chart:

Chapter 67 - Officers and Employees

Article 1A. Deputy Borough Clerk

§ 67-8.1. Office Created.

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:9-135, the office of Deputy Borough Clerk is hereby created.

§ 67-8.2. Appointment; Term.

The Deputy Borough Clerk shall be appointed by the Council for a term of one year or until the office shall have been abolished.

§ 67-8.3. Powers and Duties.

The duties of the Deputy Borough Clerk shall be:

- A. To perform all of the duties of the Borough Clerk in the absence of the Borough Clerk or when specifically assigned to do so.
- B. To perform such other duties as may be assigned by the Borough Clerk or Administrator.
- C. To perform such other duties as may be assigned by written rule, regulation, resolution or directive of the Governing Body.

§ 67-8.4. Compensation.

The Deputy Borough Clerk shall receive a salary as fixed and established by the annual Salary Ordinance of the Borough.

SECTION 2. Severability and Effectiveness Clause

- a) If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, invalid, or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.
- b) Any Ordinance inconsistent with the terms of this Ordinance is hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 3. Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect 20 days from the time of final adoption and publication in accordance with law.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 10 ADMINISTRATION OF
GOVERNMENT, ARTICLE IX, DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS, §10-34(A)
DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS**

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey that Chapter 10 Administration of Government, Article IX Department of Public Works, § 10-34(A) Director of Public Works of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Stone Harbor, 1982, is hereby amended as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 10 Administration of Government, Article IX Department of Public Works,

§ 10-34 Director of Public Works

A. There shall be an office of the Director of Public Works pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:9-154.5 et seq. and 40A:60-6. The Director of Public Works shall be appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the Council. The term shall be for a calendar year, and any vacancy during the term shall be filled only for the unexpired term.^[1] The Director of Public Works shall report to the Administrator of the Borough.

Section 2. If any portion of this ordinance is determined to be invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, that determination shall have no effect upon the remainder of this Ordinance, which shall remain valid and operable.

Section 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance, to the extent of such inconsistencies only, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect 20 days from the time of its final adoption and publication in accordance with law.

ORDINANCE NO. 1616

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 10 ADMINISTRATION OF
GOVERNMENT, ARTICLE VII ADMINISTRATIVE ORGANIZATION;
ARTICLE IX, DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS AND ARTICLE XI
DEPARTMENT OF UTILITIES; ESTABLISHING DIVISION OF UTILITIES
WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS**

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey that Chapter 10 Administration of Government, Article VII Administrative Organization, Article IX Department of Public Works and Article XI of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Stone Harbor, 1982, is hereby amended as follows:

- SECTION 1.** Chapter 10 Administration of Government, Article VII Administrative Organization § 10-27 Departments; Departments, nondepartmental offices, boards and commissions
A. Departments - Remove (4) Department of Utilities
- SECTION 2.** Chapter 10 Administration of Government, Article IX Department of Public Works

The following provision shall be added:

§ 10-35.1 Division of Utilities Established: Composition

There shall be a Division of Utilities, which Division will be in charge of the operation, maintenance, fee collection, and all other functions having to do with the day-to-day operations of the water and sanitary sewerage collection systems in the Borough of Stone Harbor. The Division shall be incorporated within and a part of the Department of Public Works. The Division of Utilities shall be under the direction, supervision, and control of the Director of Public Works.

- SECTION 3.** Chapter 10 Administration of Governments, Article IX Department of Public Works

The Following Provision shall be added:

§ 10-35.2 Utilities Collector

There shall be a Utilities Collector, who will report to the Director of Finance. The functions of the Utilities Collector shall include billing for the utilities and collection of the utility fees and charges, together with any other duty necessary or appropriate in carrying out said functions.

- SECTION 4.** Eliminate Chapter 10 Administration of Government, Article XI Department of Utilities §10-47 & §10-48 in its entirety.

SECTION 5. If any portion of this ordinance is determined to be invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, that determination shall have no effect upon the remainder of this Ordinance, which shall remain valid and operable.

SECTION 6. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance, to the extent of such inconsistencies only, be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 7. This Ordinance shall take effect 20 days from the time of its final adoption and publication in accordance with law.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 542 WATER AND SEWERS
SECTION 542-1 DEFINITIONS AND WORD USAGE AND SECTION 542-14
SANITARY COLLECTIONS SYSTEM INSTALLATION**

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey that Chapter 542 Water and Sewers of the General Ordinances of the Borough of Stone Harbor, 1982, is hereby amended as follows:

The existing provision(s) shall be stricken and the following substituted in its place:

SECTION 1. Chapter 542 Water and Sewers, § 542-1. Definitions and word usage. Remove DEPARTMENT; Department of Utilities and Replace with DIVISION; Division of Utilities throughout the Ordinance

SECTION 2. Chapter 542 Water and Sewers, § 542-14(A) to read as follows:

A four-inch building sanitary sewer shall be installed unless a larger size is applied for by the plumbing contractor and approved by the Division of Utilities. The cost of a new or replacement building sanitary sewer will be established by resolution of the Borough Council.

SECTION 3. If any portion of this ordinance is determined to be invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, that determination shall have no effect upon the remainder of this Ordinance, which shall remain valid and operable.

SECTION 4. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance, to the extent of such inconsistencies only, be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect 20 days from the time of its final adoption and publication in accordance with law.

ORDINANCE NO. 1619

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF
STONE HARBOR, CHAPTER 174 ENTITLED "BRUSH, GRASS, WEEDS & DEBRIS"
TO INCLUDE PROHIBITION OF INVASIVE SPECIES**

WHEREAS, the Borough of Stone Harbor shall designate a regulation regarding invasive species; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined the bamboo plant and other invasive plants are often difficult to control, and can and have caused significant damage to properties in the Borough of Stone Harbor; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:48-2.13, the Borough is authorized to enact ordinances requiring the destruction and removal of brush, weeds, stumps, roots and obnoxious growth where necessary to preserve the public health, safety and general welfare; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:48-2 the Borough is authorized to enact ordinances for the protection of person and property and for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the municipality and its inhabitants; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor has deemed it in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare to amend Chapter 174 of the Borough Code to regulate the growth of bamboo and other invasive species.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, County of Cape May and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION I. Chapter 174 of the Code of the Borough of Stone Harbor, entitled "Brush, Grass, Weeds & Debris" is hereby amended to add the following Section 174A as follows:

Added Section:

174A. Planting, Growing or Cultivating Bamboo and Other Invasive Plant Species

§ 174A-1. Purpose. The article is adopted to control the planting, cultivating, and/or growing of bamboo and other invasive plant species in the Borough of Stone Harbor. It is further intended to require barriers that will prevent the spread of invasive plant species, into other public or private property in the Borough of Stone Harbor.

§ 174A-2. Definitions. INVASIVE - All native and nonnative vines and vegetation that grow out of place and are competitive, persistent and pernicious; those plants may damage trees, vegetation, sidewalks or structures. Examples include, but are not limited to: bamboo as well as invasive plant species developed by the New Jersey Species Strike Team and the New Jersey Forestry Association. The terms "bamboo" and "invasive plant species" shall include but not be limited to, the following plant genera (commonly known as spreading or running type): Arundinaria, Bambusa, Chimonobambusa, Dendrocalamus, Fargesia, Phyllostachys, Pleioblastus, Sasa, Sasaella, Semiarundinaria, Ragweed, multi-flora rose, kudzu-vine and poison oak or ivy.

§ 174A-3. Prohibition.

- a) No owner, tenant or occupant of a property, or a person, corporation or other entity, shall plant, install, or cause or permit the planting or installation of any invasive or nuisance plants or vegetation, included on but not limited to, the New Jersey Invasive Strike Team "Do Not Plant" List and/or the Stone Harbor List of Invasive and Nuisance Plants (Attachment A) as recommended and approved by the Stone Harbor Natural Resources Committee and periodically updated, within any lot and/or parcel of ground anywhere within the Borough.
- b) A landscaping plan shall be submitted to the Construction/Zoning office as part of all new construction and substantial improvement projects as defined in Chapter 300 of the Borough Code. The landscaping plan shall include a list of all plants, shrubs and other vegetation that must comply with the requirements of this ordinance.

§ 174A-4. Duty to Confine.

- a) If there exists any species commonly known as "bamboo-running or clumping" or any other invasive species located upon any property within the Borough of Stone Harbor prior to the effective date of this article, there shall be a duty to confine imposed upon the owner and occupant of the property. The duty to confine shall require owners and occupants to prevent

the encroachment, spread, invasion or intrusion of bamboo and other invasive plant species onto any other private property, public property or public right-of-way.

- b) All places and premises in the Borough of Stone Harbor shall be subject to inspection by the Code Enforcement Officer or their designee when there is reason to believe that any section of this article is being violated.
- c) Property owners who seek to confine bamboo or other invasive plant species must do so in accordance with methods approved by the Borough of Stone Harbor Code Enforcement Officer. The Code Enforcement Officer may permit, inspect and approve methods of confinement and amend the requirements of said confinement from time to time. The Code Enforcement Officer may also permit, inspect and approve proper methods for full removal of bamboo or other invasive plant species.
- d) Failure to confine bamboo or other invasive plant species in accordance with the requirements set forth by the Code Enforcement Officer shall require immediate removal by the property owner or occupant.
- e) An owner or occupant with property containing bamboo or other invasive plant species prior to the adoption of this article may fully remove the bamboo or other invasive plant species in lieu of the duty to confine. Such removal must conform with the requirements set forth by the Code Enforcement Officer.

§ 174A-5. Encroachment. When an encroachment of an invasive plant species is upon public property or a public right-of-way, at its discretion, the Borough of Stone Harbor may remove or contract for the removal of such invasive plant species from the public property right-of-way. The cost of such removal shall be the responsibility of the owner and occupant of the property from which the invasive plant species originated. The cost of said removal of the invasive plant species from the public property and/or a public right-of-way shall include the cost of the installation of an appropriate barrier to prevent further encroachment by the invasive plant species.

§ 174A-6. Removal. In the event it is determined that there is an encroachment or invasion on any adjoining private or public property or public right of way, the Borough shall notify the property owner in writing that the bamboo or other invasive plant species has invaded other private or public property or public right of way and demand the removal of the bamboo or other invasive plant species from such other private or public property or public right of way and the confinement against future encroachment or the total removal of the bamboo or other invasive plant species from the owner's property. Notice shall be provided by certified, return receipt requested mail and regular mail. If the property owner in violation does not remove the bamboo or other invasive plant species from such other private or public property or public right of way within forty- five (45) days of the date of notice, the Code Enforcement Officer shall have the discretion to issue a citation with a penalty up to \$100.00 for each day the violation continues, enforceable through the Municipal Court of the Borough of Stone Harbor, as well as civil proceedings for injunctive or civil relief.

§ 174A-7. Violations and penalties. Except as otherwise in Subsection 6 above, any person, firm, corporation or other entity violating any of the provisions of this Chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to the maximum fines and penalties established under N.J.S.A. 40:49-5 and 40:69A-29, and as same shall be amended from time to time. Any such penalty shall be in addition to the costs incurred in cutting or removing said brush, hedges or other plant life described in the notice given by the Code Enforcement Officer, or their designee, of the Borough of Stone Harbor. For purposes of this article, each day on which such a condition exists after the expiration of the notice shall be deemed or constitute a separate offense under this article, and separate complaints may be filed for each such offense.

SECTION II. Severability. If for any reason any section of this Ordinance shall be declared illegal by any Court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining section of the Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect, notwithstanding.

SECTION III. Repealer. Any Ordinance or provision thereof inconsistent with this Ordinance is hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION IV. This Ordinance shall take effect 20 days of its final adoption and publication in accordance with law.

Invasive or nuisance plants (weeds) shall not be introduced into the Borough along with any landscaping plants.

The following is a partial list of plants that have been designated as invasive, i.e., they tend to spread rapidly, or nuisance plants. They have been derived from the New Jersey Invasive Species Strike Team lists and edited for those species occurring locally and available for purchase. They should not be used or distributed accidentally in any proposed planting program.
